

Terms and Conditions of Publication

- These terms and conditions will be effective as of 06/05/2015.
- Authors agree to submit an abstract of their proposed article no longer than 28 days after acceptance of an invitation to publish.
- In relation to the peer review process, authors agree for the following processes to be undertaken by peer reviewers:
 - o Suggestions with track changes and comments as regards language;
 - o Suggestions with track changes and comments as regards content, such as legal reasoning and legal analyses.
- In relation to editing process, authors agree for the following processes to be undertaken by the Editing Committee:
 - Language review (conducted by native speakers);
 - o Editing of style and footnotes according to OSCOLA;
 - o Formatting of the article; and
 - o The edited version of articles will be presented to authors for approval prior to publication, and changes may be contested. However, the Editor-in-Chief retains the right of final approval of articles for publication.
- The Journal may refuse the publications of articles which do not conform to its Publishing Profile (available at https://grojil.org/submissions/guidelines/).
- GroJIL will only publish papers that have not been previously published elsewhere.
- Once submitted for publication, the Journal may publish the articles at https://grojil.org. GroJIL may, at its discretion, publish the Journal through online databases, including via GroJIL's SSRN page.
- If an author is unable to meet a deadline previously agreed upon with the Editorial Board, they must notify the Board within a reasonable time (i.e. before the expiration of the deadline).
- In the event of late submission by an author or submission, the Journal reserves the right to publish the remainder of the relevant issue on the planned publication date, adding the late submission at a later date, upon completion of the editing process, or publish the article in the next issue. The author retains the right to withdraw their submission.



- In the event the Editorial Board finds that the submission does not reach the appropriate academic standard, the Journal reserves the right to publish the remainder of the relevant issue on the planned publication date, adding the late submission at a later date, upon completion of the editing process, or publish the article in the next issue. The author retains the right to withdraw their submission.
